**Deadline:** Entry deadline is **April 15th**. Entries received after April 22nd will incur double entry fees (\$50) and may not be cataloged. A consignor who has entries in the catalog and then later adds additional entries will be assessed the regular \$25 entry fee.

**Entry Fees - Commission:** A \$25 entry fee per head will be charged and must be paid at the time entries are submitted. *No sheep will be cataloged without proper entry fees.* A 10% commission will be charged to cover sale expenses. In addition, a 1% commission will be deducted for the American Corriedale Association; 1% for the American Junior Corriedale Association; and 1/2% for the Illinois Corriedale Association.

### Classes:

Yearling Rams - Fall Ram Lambs - January Ram Lambs - February & Later Ram Lambs

Yearling Ewes - Pair of Yearling Ewes - Fall Ewe Lambs - January Ewe Lambs - February & Later Ewe Lambs - Pair of Ewe Lambs

Best-headed Ram - Best-headed Ewe - Best Fleece

Junior, Senior and Grand Champions and Reserves will be designated for both rams and ewes. Some ewe classes may be split depending on number of entries.

**Ram/Ewe Ratio:** A consignor must enter one ewe for the first ram and two additional ewes for each additional ram entered.

**Catalog:** A catalog will be mailed to the membership of the American Corriedale Association in early May. Catalog will be posted on [www.americancorriedale.com](http://www.americancorriedale.com) and [www.sheepsales.com](http://www.sheepsales.com). If you would like to request one by mail, please call the ACA office at 618/676-1046 or Heartland Livestock Services (Curt Overcash) at 815/210-7000.

**Registration papers:** All entries must be registered at time of sale and registration papers must be turned in at check-in time on Thursday, June 4th. Transfer fees will be deducted from your settlement.

**National Corriedale Junior Show:** The National Corriedale Junior Show will be held on Thursday, June 4th at 10:00 a.m. and will be judged by Gary Heibertshausen, Attica, Ohio. Information is included in this mailing. All Junior Corriedale exhibitors should have a health paper for their Show entries. If they are consigning to the Sale they will need to meet the requirements of the Sale Sheep.

**Sale Management Statement:** Heartland Livestock Services will use its best effort to secure payment for each animal sold but does not guarantee collectibility of buyer. Sale Management will use its best efforts to provide safety and security for animals at the sale site, but does not guarantee against theft, illness or loss of animals consigned and/or sold. Settlement checks will issue approximately 3-4 weeks following the sale.

**Mail Bids:** Mail bids or phone bids must be approved by the Sale management. Whoever registers the buyer number will be responsible for payment of sheep purchased.

**Arrival:** The barn will be ready for arrival on Wednesday, June 3rd.

**Check-in:** Check in your registration and health papers at the office on Thursday from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.

**Paint Numbering:** Paint numbering will begin after the Barbecue on Thursday evening.

**Health Requirements:** Make sure you have **both flock numbers and scrapie numbers on the health paper** (unless you are on the Voluntary Scrapie Program which uses the same tag) Please show the Health paper requirements to your veterinarian and check to make sure all 7 diseases are listed--it's easy to omit one or two. You only need one health paper for all of your sheep, but please **bring readable xerox copies so that we have one for each sheep**. *Note: we will need to make another set for the veterinarian so please do not use a high-lighter on the set you turn in as the copies will not be readable.* ELIZA tests for yearling and fall ram lambs are encouraged but not mandatory and need to be done after 5-6-09.

#### **OUT-OF-STATE CONSIGNORS MUST OBTAIN A PERMIT NUMBER BEFORE ENTERING ILLINOIS.**

Either your vet or you can call the Illinois Dept. of Agriculture for the Permit Number **217/782-4944** (open 24/7)  
(Only your vet should write this on the health paper) **All entries must be tagged with Scrapie premise ID tags.**

## **Health Paper Requirements**

*Show this to your Veterinarian*

1. All sheep must be accompanied by health papers issued within 30 days prior to the sale, showing identification by legible ear tattoo, or metal or plastic eartag.
2. The issuing veterinarian shall certify that he/she observed the flock of origin and found the sheep free from visible evidence of any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease.
3. And each health paper must include the following written sentence and list all 7 diseases.
4. *Note to vets: We know the health paper should on its face cover all diseases; however, some states have requested that one or more of the following diseases be listed specifically. We apologize for this inconvenience, but it is needed since we sell sheep to several different states.)*

**These/This animal(s) are free of clinical signs of sore mouth, foot rot, caseous lymphadenitis, blue tongue, scrapie, club lamb fungus, and lice**

5. Any animal not fulfilling the first 4 requirements will be disqualified from the sale.

*Note: All entries can be listed on the same health paper and it does not need an approval stamp by your State Veterinarian. However, you must comply with the above paragraphs 1-4. No exceptions!*
