**2<sup>ND</sup> ANNUAL JR. CORRIEDALE**  
**TRIMMING & BLOCKING COMPETITION**

The purpose of this contest is to showcase our junior members' skill at preparing a Corriedale sheep for competition. Judging will be based on trimming and blocking ability, technique on handling the sheep (i.e....patience and gentleness), technique in using the various pieces of equipment and the ability to find and accentuate the good qualities of their animal. We will distribute scorecards at the show so that contestants know exactly what they will judged upon.

- There will be three divisions:
  - Beginner
    - Equipment limited to hand powered only, no electric shears.
    - 30 minute time limit (work on just one side of sheep)
    - Sheep may have been cut out or patch shorn prior to March 1<sup>st</sup> and left untouched since then (You may belly out the sheep anytime before contest if you wish.)
  - Intermediate
    - Equipment limited to hand powered only, no electric shears.
    - 60 minute time limit (work on just one side of sheep)
    - Sheep may have been cut out or patch shorn prior to March 1<sup>st</sup> and left untouched since then (You may belly out the sheep anytime before contest if you wish.
  - Advanced
    - You may use any equipment available including electric shears.
    - 90 minute time limit (You will be judged on the work done to one side of the sheep.)
    - Sheep for this division must be straight from the field. May not have been cut out or patch shorn or bellied prior to contest.
- No advance entry is required. Contestants may enter right up to the start of the contest. There is no entry fee for this contest. There will be sheep trimming equipment offered as prizes for all contestants.
- Participants must arrange to bring a Corriedale for the contest or they must arrange to borrow one from another exhibitor. For juniors not exhibiting in Ohio, contact Scott Peters and I will be happy to bring a sheep for you to trim.
- All sheep brought for the contest must have health papers.
- Participants must furnish their own equipment or arrange to secure the necessary equipment from another exhibitor.
- The judges will be the only ones allowed to offer help or advice to the participants during the contest.
